

Do this in Memory of Me

Pastoral Reflections by Rev. Wilson Andrade Death is a moment of separation. Death brings grief, pain, sorrow, sadness, shock and darkness. Yet, as baptized Christians, we believe that death is not the end of life, but an entrance into eternity. It is Jesus who gives us this hope of eternal life, through his life, death and resurrection. This mystery is proclaimed during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. It is the command of Jesus, who after the Last Supper, the First Eucharist, said to his disciples: "Do this in memory of me." The celebration of the Eucharist is the Memorial of the Passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ where we listen to the Word of God and share in the Sacrament of Christ.

During every Eucharist, we also pray for those who died in our family or in the community and continue to offer prayers for the faithful departed. One of the powerful words in the prayer of consecration is "Remember...." We are called to remember and not to forget those who have died, and pray that "they may see the light of God's face." So Eucharist brings together both living and dead into one act of prayer to God. Whenever we pray and offer Holy Mass for the persons who have died, we affirm that in baptism we shared the life on earth, so in death they become one in Christ, sharing everlasting life in heaven. So every death of a believer is a birth into eternity. In the Church, this mystery of death is publicly celebrated when we celebrate the feast of a Saint. The feast of Saints are celebrated on their day of death – a clear public witness of a holy person entering into heaven.

Wherever we gather to pray or celebrate the Holy Mass for those who died, let's remember God's saving action of love in Jesus Christ, so we all may share a place in paradise.

"Jesus, Remember me, when you come into your Kingdom" (Luke 23:42)
