Second Sunday of Advent

Pastoral Reflections by Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC

As we light the second candle in the Advent Wreath, from the scriptures we are reminded the powerful call of St. John the Baptist: "Prepare the Way of the Lord." We begin to prepare for Christmas the birth of our savoir, so let's make a list for celebration, that we may not miss most important things in our celebration. When the world dazzles around selling the best products, let's dare ourselves to silence and quiet prayers. When the world bundles around the glowing packages, let's take a brave step to unpack our souls — our sinful behaviours, our burdened hearts — so that "our paths are straight" for our Lord "to live among us." This message is addressed in the Collect prayer saying "may no earthly undertaking hinder those who set out to meet Our Lord." So this Sunday may be a time for us to prepare well to meet our Lord Jesus.

Let us not put any hindrance before our encounter with Jesus. When we encounter and experience the presence of Jesus then **Isaiah's image of perfect living** becomes a reality. Everyone would live in harmony with each other like 'wolf with lamb, leopard with kid, calf with lion.' (Is. 11:8-9) This harmonious living is expressed in welcoming and respecting one another in Jesus Christ who came to proclaim "kingdom of God."

If we want to live in harmony within the kingdom of God then we listen to that Voice in the Desert: "Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven has come near." Let us prepare our hearts and minds so that we are ready to welcome Jesus in our hearts, into our homes, in our society and the world. Let us prepare ourselves to receive Jesus, Our saviour and Lord.
