The Third Sunday in Advent is called the Gaudete Sunday, where we are called to *Rejoice* because "The Kingdom of God is near." *Gaudete* (means Rejoice) taken from the Latin translation of Phil 4: 4-5, sets a tone of joyful expectation of the Lord's Birth and Second Coming. During this time our expectations become intense as we use the "O" Antiphons as often we sing the beautiful liturgical hymns like "O come, O Come Emmanuel."

The readings help us to reflect on the beauty of the season as Prophet Isaiah invites us to reflect on this theme of Rejoice as he says "the desert will be glad and blossom." He foretells what is going to come in the days of the Lord – 'the blind will see, deaf hear and dumb sing for joy, and there will be no more sorrow.' This prophesy has come true because Jesus was born and lived on the earth. The Gospel narratives are full of stories of healings and miracles. This prophesy is confirmed by the powerful presence of John the Baptist, who even rejoiced and "leaped for joy" in the womb, upon the arrival of the Messiah. We are called to believe that our Lord is always with us and "is already at the door." So let's open the stubborn doors of our hearts and rigid minds to see and rejoice in the Lord.

"Rejoice in the Lord" these words are taken from the letter of St. Paul, who, for us, is the model of true discipleship. St. Paul, after his conversion, becomes the joyful witness of Jesus Christ – who by his preaching as a missionary and his teaching as a writer still inspires many generations to follow Jesus and find fulfillment and salvation in God's love.

We are invited in the liturgy to gather in faith and sing songs of Rejoicing. All the moments of our life in the presence of the community or alone in our rooms, - let's sing aloud – shouting or in silence – \mathbf{O}' Come, O' Come Emmanuel.... carolling away our earthly cares, as we are filled with the beauty of heaven on earth.

Lord, help me to Rejoice in you always. Amen.

The Advent Wreath - By: Allen Selman

The origin of the Advent Wreath is somewhat obscure but it probably originated in Germany or France within the Lutheran tradition. While the four candles mark the four Sundays of Advent there are certain themes which have developed over time with the meaning of each candle. The lighting of each candle in succession *symbolizes the increasing light* which Jesus as the light of the world brings creation. See Genesis 1:3, 4. Psalms 18:29; John 1:4, 5.

The circle of Advent Wreath symbolizes the *unending love of God*. It is ever-green or *perpetually green circle of life with God*.

The first, second and fourth candles may be blue (representing hope) formerly purple (representing royalty), while the third candle is traditionally pink or rose. It is also known as Gaudete (rejoice) Sunday, taken from the Introit "Rejoice (Gaudete) in the Lord always, again I say, rejoice." It reminds us to be joyful at the coming of Christ. The first and second candles allow us to reflect on the birth and Second Coming of Christ. The third candle is symbolic of John the Baptist, who was the herald of Jesus. With the fourth candle we may meditate on Mary, the tabernacle of Jesus who accepted the angelic message and remained constant in her devotion.
