

The Caribbean ecumenical team chose the song of Moses and Miriam (Ex 15:1-21) — a song of triumph over oppression — as the motif of this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Second Day of the Lord in Ordinary Time

Reflections by Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC We continue on the theme of Baptism of Jesus on this Second Sunday in the ordinary time. It is in Baptism we begin our faith journey so we continue our journey with the mission of Church entrusted by Christ. What is the Mission of Christ? John puts it poetically and we during every Eucharist express it intensely before receive the Holy Communion – "*Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the World*" (Jn. 1:29). The mission of Jesus was to "take away the sin," Jesus did that by being born like us, lived like us, died and rose again – to give us the hope of eternal life. What happens to us when the "sin is taken away?" We become the children of God. We become sons and daughters of God, joining the one family of God – "who is love".

Baptism gives us the grace to become the Children of God and to experience in an intimate way *the love of God*. So we continue to experience that call of God who calls us as St. Paul writes: "*called to be saints, together with all those who in every place call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.*" (1 Cor. 1:1). We are called to be Saints, Saints who are in communion with one another. So let's help one another to become saints in the church.

The Church after the Second Vatican Council invites every baptized Christian to respond to the "*call to holiness.*" Being good is not enough, we call called to be Holy, Saintly, going a step further being grace-filled people, being people in love with God and one another, called to holy, saintly children of God. Only then the mission of Jesus completes with our openness to the grace and power "*to become Children of God.*"
