Pastoral Reflections

By Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC *Hosanna in the Highest!* A triumphant shout echoes only at the entrance of a great king. Waving of the green palm branches is for the victorious king who enters with glory! These both words and actions belonging only to the royalty are used by the people – for a humble man riding on a donkey.

"Who is this King of Glory?" A man on a donkey! Did the people know already who is riding on a donkey! Or is it just a euphoria or excitement that comes along being in a crowd! Whatever may be the experience of the people – one experience is genuine – Jesus Christ.

Jesus was that person who brought that joy and elation to the people around him. But the euphoria of the crowd changes radically during the Passion play. It changes from singing "*Hosanna*" to "*Crucify him*" As it unfolds; the Way of joy and jubilation becomes the Way of the Cross. The Truth, remains in silence, as Jesus is condemned to die on the Cross. The Life drags on, struggles, nailed, hangs on the Cross. All the Lenten readings were preparing us to meet this – man on a donkey. But He was not an ordinary man. It is only revealed when the centurion opens His heart on the Cross: "*This man was truly the Son of God.*"

In the end the man on the donkey – dies on the cross, only to reveal the eternal mystery of our salvation – that Jesus who died on the Cross – is the Way, the Truth and the Life. The Cross becomes the symbol of God's love and *'everyone confess that Jesus Christ is the Lord.'* Amen.
