

CATHOLIC DIOCESE OF BOMADI MISSION APPEAL

The Archdiocese of Toronto has kindly given the opportunity for the Diocese of Bomadi in Nigeria to do a mission appeal in your parish this year. We are most grateful!

The Diocese of Bomadi has been a Vicariate for twenty-six years until December 15, 2017 when Pope Francis elevated it to a diocese. The Diocese is in the rural areas of Delta State in the South-South of Nigeria. The Diocese of Bomadi is being shepherded by His Excellency, Most Rev. Hyacinth Egbebo, MSP. Given that the Catholic faith is thriving in the area, and the harvest to God's Kingdom is plentiful, the economic situation of the people of Bomadi is simply poor and "heart breaking." The people have no access to clean water, roads, hospital, schools, and no electricity. There are very little job opportunities in these rural areas. The people only depend on fishing as their main source of livelihood. Not only is the river highly polluted from the oil companies, even the fish and the entire aquatic life is severely destroyed.

Most of the local population have their main source of drinking water from the River Niger. The water is quite polluted with debris and sometimes from occasional oil spillages. This same river is where the people empty all their wastes as well as sewage. This explains why the death rate is astronomically high especially among children whose immune system is not developed enough to accept this level of pollution and, as well as pregnant mothers and elderly people who are very vulnerable.

Not knowing how to tell the people of Bomadi diocese that God also loves them without being part of their fight for survival, the Diocese is undertaking a water project to help the local people improve in sanitation and to save precious lives being lost to diseases related to bad drinking water. We have this project to erect a water reservoir tank with a treatment plant estimated at the cost of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000). The unskilled labour and other necessary accessories would be supplied by the community in which it would be situated. The cost of buying a generator and the ongoing cost of servicing and supplying of fuel for the generator would be borne by the Diocese. And the facility would be managed and protected by a religious community working in the Diocese in that community.

FEEDING AND CARE OF THE ELDERLY: The Diocese is having a Feeding Programme targeted mainly at school children and elderly men and women. The elderly people are often abandoned to die mainly because of lack of means by their children who should have provided for their needs. Hence the elderlies are often seen to be witches or wizards rather than helping to care for them at their old age by their children. The Sisters of Our Lady of the Sea, (a religious congregation working in the Diocese) has as one of their apostolates to take care of the elderly men and women in their homes. This apostolate by the Sisters has been a great source of light and encouragement for the people.

We are looking at a budget of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for our feeding program next year. This part of the fund coming from your donations goes to the Sisters for their apostolate to the children from poor and disadvantaged families and as well as the elderly. Any help you give is a help given to people in dare need.

I, Fr Israel Oruebi, MSP, the parochial vicar of St Joseph's Bowmanville in the Diocese of Peterborough, has been requested by His Excellency Most Rev. Hyacinth Egbebo, MSP, the Bishop of the Diocese of Bomadi to do this mission appeal program on behalf of his Diocese. We both belong to the same Religious community — The Missionary Society of St. Paul of Nigeria. The Missionary Society of St. Paul priests are working in the Dioceses of Peterborough, Ontario, and Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, and in many countries in Europe and USA. Thanks in advance for your kind generosity to the churches in need and may God reward you all.
