#### **2019 Youth Activities Review**

We would like to thank all the youth and young adults who actively participate in many of the Parish activities. St. Ann Parish has welcomed many young people and supported them in their initial journey in Canada. St. Ann parish community would like to thank every youth who is part of our community, for her/his contribution to the growth of our community. This year we have helped four major youth groups who use St. Ann Parish for their spiritual, emotional and personal growth.

#### 1. Holy Cross Youth Movement

The Youth group began in 2011 and belong to St. Ann Parish. The motto of the Youth group is *"Together Towards Fullness."* The youth do participate in all of the Sunday liturgies and share their talents in Reading, Singing, Ushers and many of the fundraising activities. They help the recently-arrived youth in their studies and support them with time and talent. In 2019, we had 3 sessions on the Discernment to help with the vocational call and personality development.



#### 2. Raise A Roof Jamaica

In March 2019, a group of 14 teens and 5 adults completed the Raise a Roof Jamaica Mission Project. They helped to build two wooden houses in Kingston and a washroom facility in a farming community.

#### 3. Ontario Catholic Youth

OCY is part of the Archdiocese of Toronto. It has a program for the youth of Toronto to have mission experiences in Yellowknife in the northern territories. St. Ann supports them as they come back providing them with a space to share their experiences, attend a short retreat and native peoples' mass.

#### 4. Jesus Youth:

Every month a group of 40 young adults use St. Ann Parish for their spiritual activities at least once a month on Saturdays. They joined in for adoration, confession and Holy Mass.
