'Word of God' Sunday

This will be a time to focus on and celebrate the Sacred Scriptures. Accordingly, our own Cardinal Collins will be speaking about the importance of the Word of God, the Bible in the life and ministry of the believer. Cardinal Collins has his PhD in Sacred Scripture, and notably, in the Book of Revelation. As well, he regularly broadcasts Lectio Divina sessions on the Bible. His engaging style and love for Jesus and the Church will be most evident as he shares with us his insights on the central place the Bible has for Catholics today.

2020: Year of Joy - Month of January: Baptism

Pope Francis writes: "In a certain sense, Baptism is the identification card of the children of God, his certificate of birth, it is the birth certificate of the Church. The Lord Jesus is so good and he never tires of forgiving us. Even when the door that Baptism opened to enter into the Church is closed a bit because of our weakness and our sins, Confession reopens it, because it is like a second Baptism that forgives us all and illuminates us to go forward with the light of the Lord.

Baptism The day of our Baptism is the point of departure of a journey of conversion that lasts our whole life and which is

continually sustained by the Sacrament of Penance. Think of this: when we go to confess our weaknesses, our sins, we are asking forgiveness of Jesus, but we also go to renew our Baptism with this forgiveness. And this is beautiful, it is like celebrating the day of your Baptism in every Confession. It is the day in which you were born into the Church."

"It is in Baptism we put our signature to become saints." During this year of Joy and in January 2020, we shall dedicate to all the baptised Christians and all people of God that Joy of Christ may radiate in our families, Church, and the world. We encourage you to remember your own date of baptism, and remember those helped in your faith, so God may guide us to keep our Baptismal promises.

Baptism formula: "I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (cf. Mt. 28:19).

The Baptism of the Lord

Pastoral Reflections by Rev. Wilson Andrade, CSC

Today, the Church invites us to reflect on our Baptism as the Scriptures proclaims that "Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan by John" (Mk. 1:9) Now John knew his baptism was for "forgiveness of sins." Yet here is Jesus to be baptized. With much reluctance John consents to baptize Jesus, whom John knew to be sinless. When Jesus was baptized, all doors to God's grace were opened. The Spirit descending and God's voice announcing: "This is my Child, the beloved in whom I am well pleased." Now baptism is not about just for "forgiveness of sins," but about "God's love." Focus is shifting from 'me or us' to God, from sins to God's love. We believe that in every baptism and in every sacrament we receive God's love touches the human soul, 'bringing healing to our broken self, light into our gloomy life, opening our eyes to see God's glory, liberating us from clutches sin, addiction, and death'(Is.42:6-7)



Baptism is the first of the Sacrament of Initiation where a child or an adult begins the faith-journey in the Christian community. It is a beginning, not an end, as the person is on the way of salvation in Christ. It is *an on-going process* culminates only in death, where we, in faith, believe that that baptized person will rise with Christ in the Glory of God. As we have begun our *Journey of Faith* in our Baptism, let's remind ourselves of our baptismal promises of love and life in Christ our Savoir. Amen
