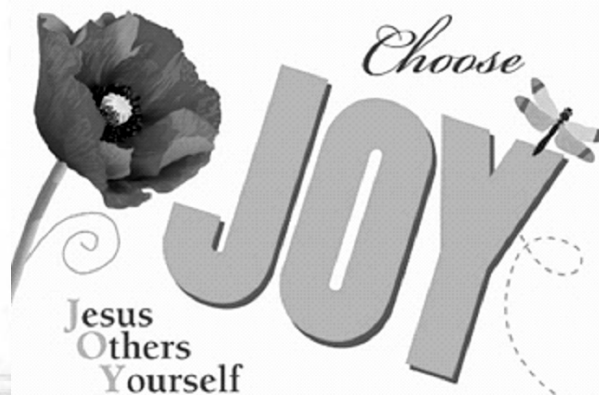

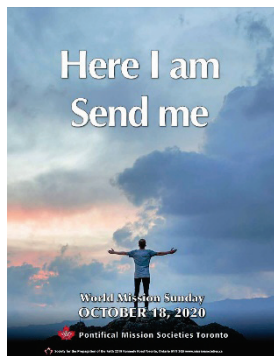

All Saints Day

“The saints were real people whose strength to face daily challenges came from the grace of Jesus Christ, showing that everyone can be holy.”

They have experienced the daily toil of existence with its successes and its failures, finding in the Lord the strength to always get up and continue the journey.”

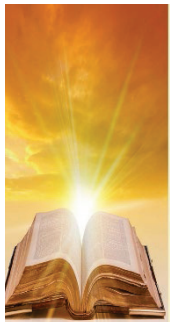
The saints demonstrate that holiness is not achieved alone, but “is the fruit of the grace of God and of our free response to it... that holiness is not only a gift from God, it is the “common vocation of the disciples of Christ.” In responding to God’s call to be holy, and accepting the gift of his grace, means taking “a serious and daily commitment to sanctification in the conditions, duties and circumstances of our life, trying to live everything with love and with charity.”

The part of holiness is becoming more and more aware of being “grafted onto Christ” and the union of vine and branches. “Then, holiness is living in full communion with God, already now, during this earthly pilgrimage.”

“The Christian holidays (All Saints and All Souls) remind us of the bond that exists between the Church of the earth (us), and that of heaven, between us and our loved ones who have passed on to the other life, the memory of the saints leads us to raise our eyes to Heaven, not to forget the realities of the earth, but to face them with more courage and with more hope.”

“May Mary, our most holy Mother, a sign of consolation and sure hope, accompany us with her maternal intercession.”

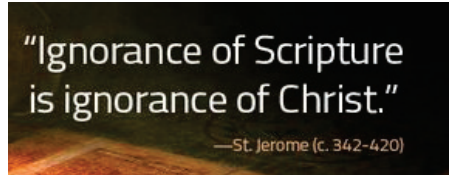
