And yet, all PRIESTS face constant criticism such as:

- the mass doesn't fill me - just thinks about money - the homily is too long

- in addition to many others ... It is easy to talk ill about a priest, yet we need them always...

One of the most difficult things in a PRIEST's life is knowing that the people for whom they give their life will betray you. The PRIEST is usually the loneliest person in the community: you can even see a PRIEST surrounded by people, but rarely by people interested in their problems, needs or even in their life, let alone in the demands that the communities themselves place on them.

If you have a PRIEST or have PRIEST as friends, take care of them, protect them, pray for them, understand their vision, support them, but above all love them, don't forget the promise of Jesus himself.

"And I will give you shepherds after my heart, who will feed you with knowledge and intelligence" (Jer 3,15). Therefore, take care of them because "they personally watch over your souls, since they will be accountable for them" (Heb 13,17).

Let us honor with our prayers the lives of all those men of God who have sacrificed so many things, including some of their own needs and that of their families to fulfill God's call.
