

after we have had our trust betrayed.


Easter invites us to let Jesus help us to love again.

Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Feast Day Celebration



Join us in celebrating the feast of our beloved indigenous saint, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, on Saturday, April 17, 2021 at 5:00 pm. The theme of our celebration is "St. Kateri Tekakwitha: Voice of Healing and Holiness."

Kateri was born in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon near the town of Auriesville, New York, in the year 1656. She was the daughter of a Mohawk chief and a Roman Catholic Algonquin, Tagaskouita. When she was four years old her baby brother and both her parents died of smallpox. She survived the disease, but was left with facial scars and impaired eyesight. She was adopted by her aunt and an uncle, a chief of the Turtle Clan. Kateri converted to Christianity in her teens and was baptized as a Roman Catholic at the age of twenty, incurring the great hostility of her tribe. Although she had to suffer greatly for her Faith, she remained firm in it. Kateri went to the Jesuit mission of Kahnawake, a new Christian colony of Indians in Canada, where she lived a life dedicated to prayer, penitential practices, and care for the sick and aged. She died on April 17, 1680 at the age of twenty-four.

We wish to honor her relevance for us as Catholics in Canada in healing and fostering relationships with indigenous peoples and the Earth. The Sisters and Associates of the Congregation of Notre Dame will join us in the celebration. At present, this celebration will be a virtual celebration as per Public Health Rules. Thank you for your support in our ministry.


