

## No Humility without Humiliation – Pope Francis

- In the life of a Christian, humility is an indispensable quality that is needed in order to allow the gifts of the Holy Spirit to grow. Every Christian is like a small shoot on which the Spirit of the Lord rests, the spirit of wisdom and intelligence, the spirit of counsel and fortitude, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. These are the gifts of the Holy Spirit which grow from the smallness of the bud to the fullness of the Spirit. This is the promise, this is the Kingdom of God" and "the life of the Christian."
- The task of a Christian is to be aware that each of us is a "sprout of that root which must grow with the power of the Holy Spirit, to the fullness of the Holy Spirit in us." And our task, is to safeguard this sprout, this growth which is the Spirit. It takes faith and humility to believe that this bud, this small gift will grow to the fullness of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. It takes humility to believe that the Father, Lord of Heaven and Earth, has hidden these things from the wise and the learned and revealed them to the little ones.
- Humility means to be small, like the sprout that grows little by little to the fullness of life through the power of Holy Spirit. Being humble does not mean being polite, courteous or closing one's eyes in prayer. Being humble means being able to accept humiliations. "Humility without humiliation, is not humility." A humble man or a woman is one who is able to endure humiliations like Jesus "the great humiliated one."
- Sometimes we think that humility is to go quietly, perhaps head-down looking at the floor... but even pigs walk with their heads down: this is not humility. This is that fake, ready-to-wear humility, which neither saves nor guards the heart. We have to be aware that there is no true humility without humiliation, and if you are not able to tolerate, to carry humiliation on your shoulders, you are not truly humble: you pretend you are, but you are not".
- "Let us ask the Lord for the grace of humility, with humiliations. There was a nun who used to say: 'yes, I am humble, but never humiliated!' No, no! There is no humility without humiliation. We are asking for this grace. And if someone is brave – just as St. Ignatius teaches us - we can even ask the Lord to send humiliations so we can be more like the Lord".
