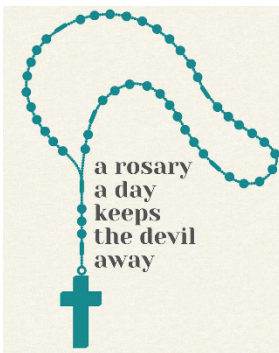
**2021: The Call to Holiness**

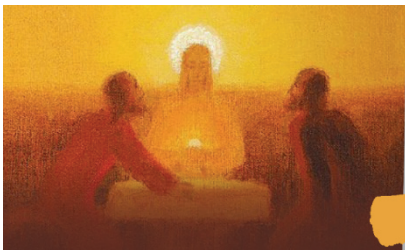
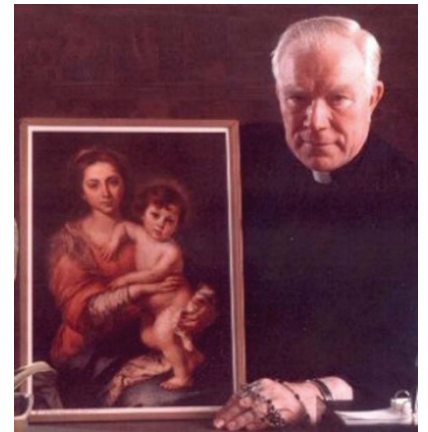
and lastly by our Sacred service to others, we can bring God's holiness and proclaim it to the whole world.
