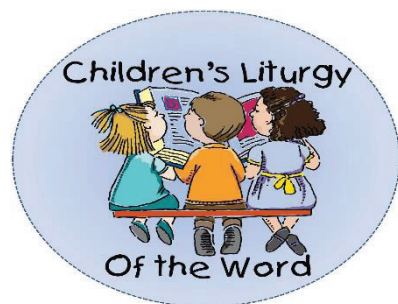

Pope Francis writes: *“The same mindset which stands in the way of making radical decisions to reverse the trend of global warming also stands in the way of achieving the goal of eliminating poverty. A more responsible overall approach is needed to deal with both problems: the reduction of pollution and the development of poorer countries and regions. In the twenty-first century, while maintaining systems of governance inherited from the past, is witnessing a weakening of the power of nation-states, chiefly because the economic and financial sectors, being transnational, tends to prevail over the political.”* LS# 175.

The International Day for the Eradication of Poverty is held annually on October 17th, to promote *“Building Forward Together: Ending Persistent Poverty, Respecting all People and our Planet”*. Families across the world are paying too high a price to cover the cost of their homes. Rent and homeownership costs are skyrocketing, while wages are not keeping pace. Everywhere you look—cities, suburbs, rural areas.—. we see the consequences that the climate crisis has brought to many areas of the world, such as drought, floods, fires, and earthquakes.

People in undeveloped countries around the world, living in poverty experience many interrelated and mutually reinforcing deprivations that prevent them from realizing their rights and perpetuate their poverty, including: dangerous work conditions, unequal access to justice, limited access to health care, unsafe housing, lack of nutritious food and clean water, lack of political power.
