Here are some ideas that will have an impact on our Common Home:

- Do a bit of online research and buy only from companies that you know have sustainable
- practices and don't harm the environment.
- Use a power bar to plug in electronic devices and turn them off when they are not in use.
- Taking a short shower use less water than taking a bath.
- Avoid pre-heating the oven. Unless you need a precise baking temperature, start heating
- your food right when you turn on the oven.
