INTERNATIONAL DAY FOR PREVENTING THE EXPLOITATION OF THE ENVIRONMENT IN WAR AND ARMED CONFLICT

Pope Francis writes: *"It is foreseeable that, once certain resources have been depleted, the scene will be set for new wars, albeit under the guise of noble claims. War always does grave harm to the environment and to the cultural riches of peoples, risks which are magnified when one considers nuclear arms and biological weapons."* "LS #57

On November 6th every year, the UN observes the International Day for Preventing the Exploitation of the Environment in War and Armed Conflict.

The day seeks to make people aware of the consequences that war and conflict have on the environment. Loss of life and the destruction of property are consequences of war and armed conflict, in addition to the negative effect that war and conflict has on the environment: water pollution, torched crops, poisoned soil, dead animals, destruction of forests. Sometimes these things are even done in order to gain a military advantage. There are also conflicts that involve natural resources, such as oil, gold, diamonds, and timber. According to the United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP), 40 percent of internal conflicts have been linked to the exploitation of natural resources in the last 60 years. This year, we are facing Ukraine-Russian War, creating an instability for all the world in terms of food, economy, and environmental situation.

What can I do? Read the article "Freeing Hearts from Hatred" that details Pope Francis' visit to a Jesuit community of Priests and Bishops in Russia. Pope Francis speaks about the Ukraine - Russian War as World War III. He asks that all people of the world free their hearts from hatred and not look at each other as aggressors or enemies. He also asks that we pray the Rosary Daily for Peace. "Let there be peace on earth and Let it begin with me!"
