
Summer is a great time to travel with friends and family. It is also within these days that we have the opportunity to slow down from our fast-paced lives and enjoy

When Jesus went back to his hometown after beginning his public ministry, one can imagine the feelings that he would have felt – the excitement and joy of

going back to the place he called home. Yet in the Gospel, we see that the reaction of the people in his hometown was one of disbelief and rejection.

The people of Nazareth couldn't believe that Jesus, the son of Joseph the carpenter, one whom they had known for all his life turned out to be this man of great wisdom who would perform great miracles. This response was also experienced by Ezekiel in the first

reading when God told him that if the Israelites rejected God himself, how much more would they reject God's prophet?

When we begin to live a life pleasing to the Lord, a life of generous offering of our time and talent, it is not uncommon to experience various difficulties in trying to do so. Like Jesus, we may be ridiculed or rejected by those closest to us and shunned by others. These difficulties, as St. Paul mentioned in the second reading, are permitted not because God can't take them away, but because God uses them for our sanctification and holiness.

The Christian life was never promised to be easy, and Jesus himself experienced those hardships. What are we willing to give up for the sake of Christ and the Gospel? Are we willing to experience hardships, rejection, and persecution the way Jesus was?
