


In the Gospel this Sunday we hear the following passage: "When the days drew near for him to be taken up, Jesus set his face to go to Jerusalem." As

Jesus' passion on Calvary loomed nearer He did not shy away from His mission, but rather, He firmly fixed His gaze on accomplishing what He was sent out to do. This is the model that we should follow as stewards.

Our mission is to gratefully and generously offer our time and talents to our parish community as a means of serving Christ and the Church. While our stewardship will undoubtedly be filled with many moments of great peace and joy, we are also sure to experience moments of hardship. We may experience the temptation of giving up or making excuses as to why we shouldn't continue to serve. We may also be afraid of the crosses that arise during our apostolates. Jesus too was aware of the great cross and suffering that lay in the horizon of His mission. Despite all this, He remained steadfast. We should pray to God every day, asking Him for the strength to persevere in our call of stewardship. Even in difficult moments, let us readily turn to God. St. John Paul II encourages us saying, "Don't be afraid of the radicalness of His demands... If He asks much of you it is because He knows you can give much." The Lord has great plans to use us as missionary disciples, we just need to say yes to His invitation.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus commissions the disciples who were following him and sent them out two by two to all the places which Jesus intended to go. They

were sent to prepare the way, and to prepare the hearts of the people, that they will be able to receive Jesus and his message when he comes. However, there are two stark realties that Jesus conveys to the disciples about their journey.

First, the harvest is plenty, but the labourers are few. The world is ripe for the harvest, but unfortunately,

the number of people willing to go out and work for the sake of the building up of the Kingdom of God is few. This reality was present in Jesus' time and continues to be a reality today. Jesus calls many yet only a few listen and answer the call. The second reality is that when we are sent, we are like lambs in the midst of wolves. Jesus knew that the preaching of the Gospel would come with its opposition and persecution. These same oppositions are what would ultimately lead Jesus to the cross and cause the deaths of many of his disciples.

Jesus knows that the work will be difficult and warns the disciples of this, yet he promises to be with us. As the Lord speaks through Isaiah in the first reading, he tells us that as a mother comforts her child, so the Lord will comfort those who are doing his will. As stewards, we are called to labour for God's kingdom, a work that can be difficult and a work that is lifelong. The harvest is plenty, and the labourers are few. Let us spend time to reflect on the ways that the Lord calls us, and to be open-hearted to accept Christ's invitation to share our time and talent. Let us also pray in a special way this week for those who are labouring, and that even more people may hear the Lord's call and work in his harvest.
